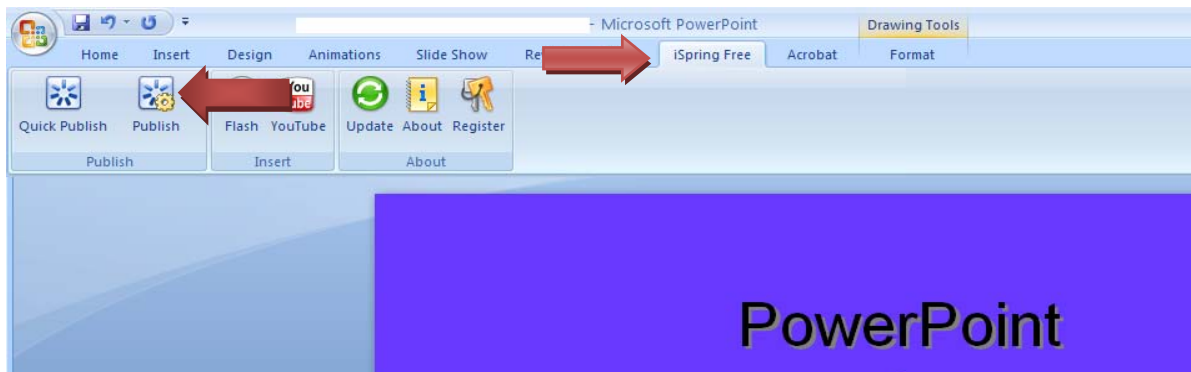
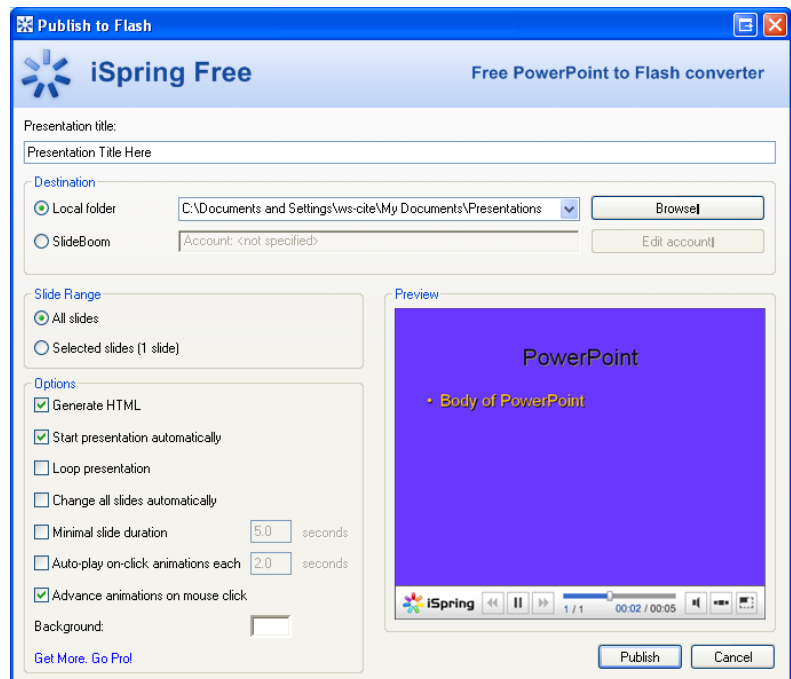


How to Convert a PowerPoint into Flash

When either uploading or submitting a PowerPoint that contains a large amount of images or sounds, sometimes it is best to convert it into a flash video. A free program to do so is [iSpring Free](#). iSpring Free is a free program, that once installed, adds a menu to Microsoft Office PowerPoint. This menu allows you to insert Flash formatted videos or YouTube videos into a PowerPoint, along with converting the PowerPoint to a Flash Video.



Once your PowerPoint is finished, and ready to be converted, click the “**iSpring Free**” tab, and “**Publish**”. On the next window, you can select where you want the files to be saved, along with how many slides you want inserted into the video, if you want the HTML coding to upload it to a website, and if you want it to automatically progress. The default settings are best if you want to click to progress through slides, and want to keep it simple. By using iSpring to convert your presentation, it becomes simpler to keep all of the content that was needed to make the presentation work correctly, all in a single .swf file.



Once you click publish, the program will start to convert the presentation, open it up in an internet browser, and save the final files where you had specified in the window. When uploading the files to a site, you must upload all of the files created after converting the presentation.
