

Technical Requirements

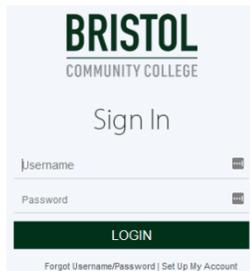

We recommend the use of the following web browsers and mobile applications:



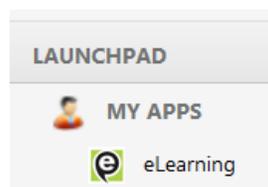
How to access eLearning



Log into **accessBCC** at <https://accessbcc.bristolcc.edu>

If you have not yet logged in, make sure you click the link to “Set up My Account.”

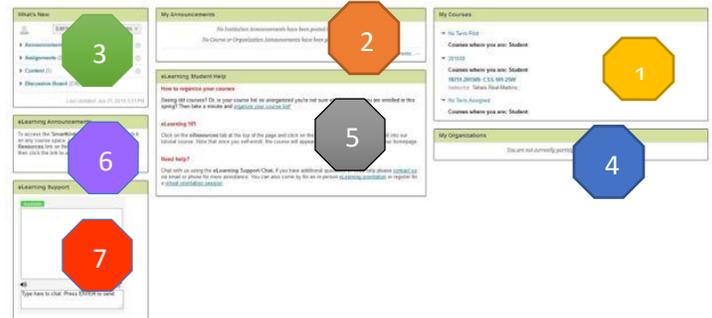
Once you are logged into accessBCC, click the eLearning link located under the LAUNCHPAD located on the left-hand side of the page.



Need help logging in?

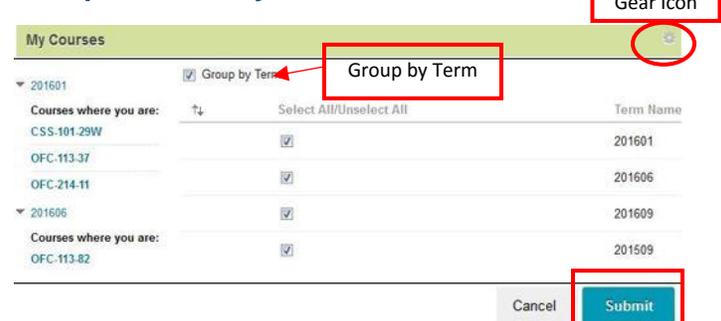

Navigating eLearning



1. **My Courses:** displays a list of courses you are currently enrolled in.
2. **My Announcements:** displays announcements such as upcoming maintenance and useful tips.
3. **What’s New:** displays announcements, content, discussions, and any other related information posted by the instructor.
4. **My Organizations:** displays the eLearning 101 course and/or any other community course you enrolled yourself in.
5. **eLearning Student Help:** displays information on how to help you navigate and organize your course, eLearning Orientation, and contact information.
6. **eLearning Announcements:** displays information and content related to your eLearning courses.
7. **eLearning Support:** You will see the “available” in green when someone is available to chat with you online.

Group Courses by Term



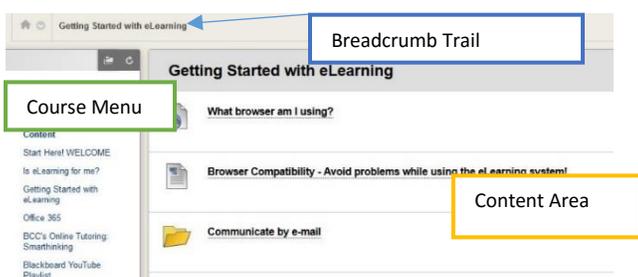
Click on the **gear icon** in the upper right corner of the *My Courses* and check the box that says **Group by Term** and click **Submit**.

To Enter a Course

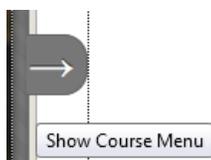


Click on the *course title* in the **My Courses** area to go your course home's page.

Course Navigation



On the left side of the screen, you will see the *Course Menu*. Each of the links on the Course Menu contains related **Course Content** that is organized usually into Weeks, Units, or Modules containing course material such as syllabus, lectures, homework, assignments, discussion forums, and other additional resources.



If you don't see your course menu, move your cursor over to the left-hand side of the screen. A right-facing arrow should appear. Click on the arrow to expand the menu.

Breadcrumb Trail



Another way to navigate the course is by using the "*Breadcrumb Trail*." Breadcrumbs list the path of pages that you have visited and are located at the top of the each page.

Discussions

Discussion Forums will be found in almost every class you take and they can be accessed through the weekly folders or through the course menu. They are a tool used to communicate with your fellow students and your instructors.

Course Messages

Email

Course Messages provide you with a familiar, email-like environment that you can use for course communication.

However, unlike email, you can only access this private and secure text-based form of communication by logging in to your course. On the other hand, sending **Email** you can choose to send email messages to your instructor and classmates. You'll receive course emails directly in your Office 365 bristolcc.edu account. You will compose responses directly from your own email not through the course.
